Dear Sir:

Your letter of December 19 replying to this city's communication under date of December 17, calling attention to the fact that for certain portions of the day the sewage plant by-passes sewage past the dosing tanks and the sprinkling filters, has been received.

We should again like to call your attention to the fact that such sewage is by-passed, as examination of the creek to the west of your plant will show. It is true that this sewage is not the raw sewage, our letter being in error in this point, it being the clarified sewage after passing through the new settling tank. Clarified sewage still carries from 40 to 50% of the settleable matter and all of the putrescible dissolved organic matter found in raw sewage, and is producing conditions practically as objectionable as would the raw sewage itself. We are confidently of the opinion that you should be operating the purification end of your process 24 hours every day, because of the strong domestic nature of your sewage and that nothing else will suffice to bring about proper conditions within the city.

We urge your further investigation of these facts and the undesirability of the continuance of this practice due to conditions which it sets up in open streams which pass through the corporate limits of Grand Rapids.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section one. Section one of an ordinance passed and approved April 2, 1923, entitled "An ordinance to regulate the operation and use of vehicles on the public streets and highways of the Village of East Grand Rapids and to regulate and limit the gross weight of all such vehicles," is hereby amended to read as follows;

Section 1. It shall be unlaful to operate any vehicle upon the public streets and highways of this Village, the gross weight of which exceeds Ten Tons, if on pneumatic tires, Five tons if on solid tires, non-pneumatic.

This amended ordinance is ordered to take effect June 26, 1924.

Section 1. Sections five (5) and seven (7) of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones, and to classify, regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and ~~and~~ for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof". Approved April 3, 1922, are hereby amended to read as follows:

~~Section 5.~~ RESIDENCE DISTRICT A. The following lands and premises not within the Commercial District is hereby designated as the "Residence District A; All the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Bagley Avenue, Croswell Avenue and Lovett Avenue and lying north of a line parallel with and one hundred and fifty (150) feet north of the north line of Lake Drive; All lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting and abutting upon either side of Wealthy Street from the west village boundary limits to Lovett Avenue, and on either side of Greenwood Avenue, and on the north side of Lakeside Drive from Greenwood Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard. The boundary line for said Residence District "A" shall be the rear lot lines of the lands and premises within said district that has been and is now, or that hereafter may be, divided into blocks and lots, but such boundary line shall not be less than one hundred and fifteen (115) feet back from the street line. In the case of unsubdivided lands within said districts, such boundary line shall extend back at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet from the abutting street line.

In the Residence District "A" all buildings and premises, except as otherwise provided in the ordinance, shall be erected for and used exclusively as:

1. Any use permitted in Residence District B.
2. Two Family dwellings.
3. Multiple dwellings.
4. Hotels, Boarding houses and lodging houses.
5. Colleges and Churches
6. Libraries, Hospitals and Sanitariums
7. Private Clubs and Fraternal Buildings.

Section 7. PUBLIC BUILDINGS. Public Buildings, schools, fire or police stations, jails, water pumping stations, water storage reservoirs and tanks, or other buildings or structures used for municipal purposes, hereafter erected by the village or school district, may be erected or used in any location which the Village Council deems for the public convenience or welfare; Provided, however, that in fixing a location for any such use the council shall have due regard for, and take in consideration, the promotion of the public health, safety and general welfare, and also shall give reasonable consideration, among other things, to the character of the district wherein ~~the~~ it is proposed to locate such building or structure and to the conservation of property values. This ordinance is ordered to take effect *September 2<sup>d</sup>* 1924.

And Be It Further resolved that a public hearing to consider such proposed amendment be held at the council rooms in this Village on Monday, August 25, 1924, at eight o'clock P.M., at which time and place this council shall meet and consider any objections or written protests to said proposed amendment.

WHEREAS, at a regular meeting of the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids held in the Councilroom in said village, on the 2nd day of September, 1924, the said Council met for the purpose of hearing objections to the construction of a curb on Lake Drive, a public street in said village from the west boundary limits to the Pere Marquette Railroad crossing, and to the widening of the concrete pavement in said street, as shown by the map, plan, diagram and specifications on file with the Village Clerk, and also to hear objections to the district to be assessed for said improvement as shown by said map, plan and diagram, and after hearing all objections and suggestions thereto of all parties appearing and desiring to be heard and after due consideration being had thereon, the said Council did by resolution order the aforesaid improvement to be made, and approved and adopted the said map, plan, diagram and specifications for said improvement, and did establish a special assessment district of all the lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Lake Drive and lying between said Village boundary limits and said railroad crossing, as shown and described in the map, plat and diagram of said district on file with said clerk, to defray one-half of the cost of said improvement, and excepting from said district certain lots and parcels of land marked on said map, plat and diagram as being exempted from assessment for said improvement, and did also estimate the total cost of said improvement at the sum of \$ 27,793.01, and ordered one-half of said estimate to be assessed upon the lots and parcels of land within said special assessment district not exempted from assessment as aforesaid, and ordered the Board of Assessors to make an assessment roll and to assess and levy said sum upon the lots and parcels of land within said district; and

WHEREAS, the owners of the aforesaid exempted lots in said district have heretofore constructed a curb and strip of concrete pavement five feet wide in front of their said lots at their own expense, and this Council intends to refund to said owners one-half of said expense as near as the same can be estimated, and to require said lots to pay one-half of their proportion of the cost of paving street intersections heretofore constructed in said Lake Drive, by the Village out of the general highway funds, and for paving street intersections, grading, engineering, and other work required to be done by the plans and specifications for said improvement, according to foot frontage, and at the same uniform rate per foot frontage that all others remaining lots abutting upon said improvement will be required to pay; and that one-half of the estimated cost for constructing and completing a curb and strip of concrete pavement, five feet wide on either side of the pavement now in said street in front of and opposite all those lots and parcels of land in said district which do not now have such curb and five foot pavement in front of them, as shown by said map, plat, plan and diagram, be assessed upon all such lots and parcels of land, according to foot frontage,

Now, Therefore, be it RESOLVED, that th said resolution heretofore and on said 2nd day of September, 1924, passed and adopted by this Council be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

RESOLVED, that the aforesaid improvement be made, and that the map, plat, plan, diagram and specifications for said improvement now on file in the office of the Village Clerk be approved and adopted and that all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of said Lake Drive and lying between the west boundary limits of the Village and the Pere Marquette Railroad crossing in said village and within the boundaries of said district as the same is determined and shown and described in the map, plat and diagram of said district now on file in the office of the Village Clerk shall constitute and be a special assessment district to be known as the Lake Drive Paving District No. 3, and be it

Further RESOLVED, that the expense of completing the aforesaid curb and the widening of the concrete pavement now in said street according to the said map, plans and specifications, be and the same hereby is estimated at the sum of \$ 14,264.76; that one-half of the said estimated sum be assessed upon and against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying within said special assessment district and in front of and opposite of which said curb and said strip of concrete pavement five feet wide is to be laid and constructed as shown by said map, plat and diagram, according to foot frontage; and further, that the expense of paving the street intersections heretofore laid by the Village on said Lake Drive and within said district, and the expense of paving street intersections, grading, engineering and other work required to be done by the plans and specifications adopted for said improvement, including the cost of said map, plat, diagram, specifications and estimates, and the surveys, plans and assessments incident thereto, be and the same hereby is estimated at the sum of \$ 13,529.25; that one-half of said last estimated sum be assessed upon and against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying within said special assessment district, as shown by said map, plat and diagram, according to foot frontage, and that the amount so assessed against each lot and parcel of land be paid in five annual installments with interest upon the deferred installments at the rate of six percent per annum, and that one-half of the entire cost of said improvement be paid from the general highway fund to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in said village of East Grand Rapids, said tax to be divided in five parts and to be collected annually for five years; and be it

Further RESOLVED, that all owners of lots and parcels of land within said special assessment district, who have heretofore constructed a curb and strip of concrete pavement five feet wide in front of and opposite their said lots and premises, at their own expense, except any part thereof which must be relaid, be and they are hereby credited with one-half of \$ 1.50 for each foot frontage of their said lots in front of which such curb and strip of pavement has been heretofore laid, which said sum is the sum estimated to be the cost of such curb and strip of pavement by this Council per running foot, and that such sum be refunded to said owners in five annual installments as soon as the same shall be collected by said village upon the assessment rolls to be adopted for said improvement; and be it

Further RESOLVED, that the Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to assess and levy the one-half part of said estimated sum of \$ 14,264.76 upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land and premises in front of which said curb and strip of concrete pavement is to be laid, as shown by said map, plat and diagram, according to foot frontage; and that said Board of Assessors be and they are hereby also directed to assess and levy the one-half part of said estimated sum of \$ 13,529.25 upon all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land and premises lying within said special assessment district for the payment of the cost of paving street intersections, grading, engineering, and other work required by said plans and specifications, according to foot frontage, and that said Board of Assessors do credit the one-half part of \$1.50 per foot for each foot of frontage of all such lots and parcels of land having such curb and strip of pavement already laid in front thereof, except such as must be relaid, to the owners of all such lots and premises, as shown by said map, plans and specifications; that said Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to make and prepare a special assessment roll of all said lands and premises within said district, said roll to be in five parts, one part to be collected in the current year, to-wit, 1924, and one of said parts to be collected annually thereafter and until the whole is collected, and if from the shape or size of any such lot an assessment thereon in proportion to its frontage would be unjust and disproportionate to the assessments upon other lots, said Board shall assess such lot for such number of feet frontage as the Board deems to be equitable and just; and be it

ORDERED that said Board of Assessors appotion against the Village of East Grand Rapids one-half of the cost of said improvement to be apid from the Village Highway Fund and to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in the Village in five annual installments and it is further

ORDERED that said Board of Assessors report said roll to the Council at this meeting.

RESOLUTION OFFERED BY TRUSTEE M. W. OSBORN:

RESOLVED, That the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids proposes, that the Zoning Ordinance of the Village be amended as follows:

A N O R D I N A N C E

to amend Section Five of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to establish districts or zones in the village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones; and to classify, regulate and restrict the locations of trades and industries, to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof", Approved April 3rd, 1922, as amended by an ordinance approved August 25th, 1924.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. That Section five of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones, and to classify, regulate and restrict location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof" and approved April 3rd, 1922 and as amended by ordinance approved August 25th, nineteen hundred twenty four, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. RESIDENCE DISTRICT A. The following lands and premises not within the Commercial District is hereby designated as the "Residence District A"; All the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Bagley Avenue, Crosswell Avenue and Lovett Avenue and lying north of a line parallel with and one hundred and fifty (150) feet north of the north line of Lake Drive; All lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Wealthy Street, from the west village limits to Lovett Avenue, and on either side of Greenwood Avenue, and on the north side of Lakeside Drive from Greenwood Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard; and all of lots numbered fifty-two to fifty-six inclusive of T. E. Reed's Addition to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, as now recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Kent County, Michigan, The boundary line for said Residence District "A" shall be the rear lot lines of the lands and premises within said district that has been and is now, or that may hereafter be, divided into blocks and lots, but such boundary line shall not be less than one hundred and fifteen (115) feet back from the street line. In the case of unsubdivided lands within said district, such boundary line shall extend back at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet from the abutting street line.

In the Residence District "A" all buildings and premises, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, shall be erected for and used exclusively as:

1. Any use permitted in Residence District B.
2. Two family dwellings.
3. Multiple dwellings.
4. Hotels.
5. Boarding and Lodging houses.
6. Colleges and churches.
7. Libraries, Hospitals and Sanitariums.
8. Club Houses and Fraternal Buildings.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing upon the adoption of said proposed amendment to said ordinance be held at the Council Room in said village on Friday, the 5th, day of December, 1924 at 8 o'clock in the evening and that the Village Clerk be and he is hereby directed to cause notice of said proposed amendment and hearing to be published in the Grand Rapids Herald, a newspaper having a general circulation in said Village, at least fifteen days before said hearing, which said notice shall contain the gist of said proposed amendment and notify all persons interested and desiring to object or be heard upon the adoption of said proposed amendment, that they will be heard at that time and place, and that if any person desires to object to such proposed amendment, he shall make such objections in writing and file the same with the village clerk before the hour of said meeting.

A large number of interested property owners and residents of the Village were present to discuss this matter and they were given an opportunity to state their views pro and con.

After a thorough discussion, Trustee Osborn moved the adoption of the resolution. Supported by Trustee Swain.

All this to be done so as to give the Council an expression of the general sentiment of the people regarding this question.

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The Attorney reported that he had talked with Mr. Remington in regard to his offer to donate certain lands to the Village for Park purposes, that he had thoroughly investigated this proposition and that about the only restrictions Mr. Remington proposed, were that no public games, such as base ball or foot ball could be held, on said grounds, attracting large crowds. Also that he expected to have water mains extended on Lakeside Drive to the house which he is building and also on Robinson Road.

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In as much as the Council was not ready at the present time and for some time to come to lay a water main on Robinson Road, the Attorney was given further time to consult with Mr. Remington.

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Trustee Huebner reported on the condition of the sidewalk on the south side of Argentina Drive, stating that this walk was in bad condition, before Blum & Dickinson broke it up in constructing the sewer in said street.
